# Section 1: Permits

## A. Permit Requirements

- A1. All individuals 18 years of age or older (on or before 01 August of the permitted hunting year) are required to purchase a Permit to access Avon Park Air Force Range.
- A2. An appropriate photo ID card identifying the status of the bearer shall be presented upon pick-up of any Permit from the Outdoor Recreation Office. All persons 16 years or older shall carry some form of current photographic identification while on the installation.
- A3. Purchase of any Permit certifies that the individual named on the Permit has signed a Release of Liability and a statement that he/she understands and will abide by these regulations. The U.S. Air Force is not responsible for the personal property of Permit Holders.
- A3.1. By accepting any Avon Park AFR Permit, Permit Holders give consent to have their vehicles searched while on the installation. If a vehicle is towed or impounded, Permit Holders are liable to reimburse the towing agent on behalf of the vehicle owner/operator.
- A4. All Permit Holders shall receive an Annual Safety Briefing prior to receiving a Permit.
- A5. All children under the age of 18, wherein the Permit Holder is not their legal guardian, shall have a properly completed Parental Consent Form on file before the Permit Holder can bring the underage child as a Guest. Parental Consent Forms expire 31 July of each year.
- A6. All persons under the age of 18 must ride in the vehicle with a Permit Holder.
- A7. Military Permits are available for Active Duty and Retired Military personnel or 100% Disabled Veterans. A valid Military CAC Card or Military ID must be presented at the time of Permit pick-up.
- A8. Staff Permits are available for full-time APAFR Civilian Employees, Cooperators and Contractors, and current APCI staff. Former or retired APCI or APAFR personnel are not eligible. Camper Storage at Austin Hammock Campground is not authorized for Staff Permits.
- A9. All Permits are non-refundable and non-transferrable.



### BY RECEIPT OF A PERMIT, THE PERMIT HOLDER:

1. Agrees to read and abide by the regulations and restrictions contained in this instruction and/or any regulations issued under the authority of the Installation Commander.
2. Understands that the Avon Park Air Force Range is an active armament test range and, as such, users could encounter unexploded ordnance (UXO) and assumes the risk associated with engaging in outdoor recreation on the Public and Military Recreation Areas.
3. Agrees that engaging in outdoor recreation on the Avon Park Air Force Range is at their own risk and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the United States of America against any and all claims for loss, damage, or injury, whether caused by negligence or otherwise, sustained to their person or property or to the person or property of any minors under their care or control.
4. Recognizes that open portions of the Recreation Areas are subject to short-term or temporary closures in support of military test and training missions, and that viewing the Weekly Range Forecast prior to entering the Recreation Areas is mandatory.

## B. Permit Types & Fees

Permits listed below are sold **per individual**. Every individual must purchase his/her own Permit(s) through is/her own iSportsman account. Permits purchased incorrectly or on behalf of another individual will be considered a donation to the Outdoor Recreation Program and no Permit will be issued (see para A7.).

### HUNT-TYPE PERMITS

#### B1. ANNUAL HUNT PERMITS

**800** available

Allows the Permit Holder to hunt (excluding participation in Limited Entry Dog Hunts), fish, camp, or engage in any allowed recreational activity. Hunt and Companion Hunt Permit Holders may bring in one (1) Hunt Guest as stated in para B6.

#### B2. MILITARY ANNUAL HUNT PERMITS

Available to eligible Active Duty, Retired Military personnel, 100% Disabled Veterans, and their spouses or significant others. Allows 7-day access to the Military Recreation Area (MRA) and weekend-only access to the Public Recreation Area (PRA). Camper Storage at Austin Hammock Campground is included in this Permit. Refer to para B1. for authorized activities.

## B4. PURPLE HEART HUNT PERMITS

Available to Purple Heart Recipients and their spouses or significant others. Grants all activities as outlined in para B2. Camper Storage at Austin Hammock Campground is included in this Permit.

## NON-HUNT RECREATION PERMITS

### B5. PRA RECREATION PERMITS

300 available

Allows the Permit Holder to fish, camp, or engage in any allowed recreational activity, with the exception of taking wildlife. However, a Recreation Permit Holder may ride in a vehicle with a Hunt Permit Holder. Recreation Permit Holders may bring in up to three (3) children under the age of 18 free of charge. Recreation Permit Holders may not bring in Hunt Guests at any time. Recreation is restricted to the Kissimmee River boat ramp, the Van Eeghan fish ponds and Tomlin Hammock Lake, and Willingham, Morgan Hole and Fort Kissimmee Campgrounds, during the duration of Archery, Muzzleloader and General Gun seasons, unless being escorted by a Hunt Permit Holder as mentioned.

## GUEST PERMITS

### B6. HUNT GUEST PERMITS

Allows the Permit Holder to hunt, fish, camp, or engage in any allowed recreational activity, while under the direct supervision of a current Hunt or Companion Hunt Permit Holder. Direct supervision is herein defined as being within visual or voice range (electronic communication is acceptable if hunting in the same Management Unit). Failure to properly escort and supervise any Hunt Guest will result in the suspension of privileges of the Hunt Guest and the host Permit Holder.

**HUNT GUEST PERMITS SHALL NOT BE PURCHASED BY A HUNT OR COMPANION HUNT PERMIT HOLDER ON BEHALF OF HIS/HER GUEST.**

### HUNT GUEST PERMIT

\$75

- Unavailable opening weekends of each hunt season & the first four (4) weekends of Spring Turkey season. Hunt Guests shall share a vehicle with their host Hunt Permit Holder.
- Hunt Guest Permits are valid for one (1) visit per purchase, up to a maximum of eight (8) visits during a single permit year.
- Hunt Guest Permits are valid until picked up, except as outlined above.

## C. Obtaining a Permit

C1. All individuals eligible for a Permit at Avon Park Air Force Range, as stated in Section 1-A, shall purchase a Permit using the following steps:

C1.1. Log on to <https://avon.isportsman.net>.

C1.2. Click on the “Log In” tab. Sign in using your Login ID and password; if creating an iSportsman account for the first time, click on the “Register” tab.

C1.2.1. To register an account for the first time, enter all required information. All iSportsman account information shall match that on the individual’s current Driver’s License. Falsified account information may result in suspension of recreation privileges.

C1.2.2. It is the responsibility of the individual to verify his/her account information when setting up an account or renewing a Permit. All individuals shall update their iSportsman account information annually, especially the contact and vehicle information.

C1.2.3. A valid email address is required and is the only way to recover a forgotten Login ID or password online. A forgotten Login ID can also be recovered, or a forgotten password reset, by calling the Outdoor Recreation Office during posted business hours.

C1.2.4. **DO NOT** create a duplicate iSportsman account. If you have trouble accessing your account, contact the Outdoor Recreation Office for assistance. Individuals creating duplicate or multiple iSportsman accounts may be subject to suspension of recreation privileges.

C1.3. Click the “My Safety Briefs” tab on the account homepage. Watch the UXO safety briefing video.

C1.4. Click the “Acquire Permits” button to purchase the desired Permit(s).

C2. Permits will only be available for purchase Mondays through Thursdays each week to allow time for processing for the upcoming weekend. Permits will only be available for pickup when Outdoor Recreation is open for public access, unless prior arrangements have been made with staff.

# Section 2: Access

## D. Access Procedures

- D1. Permit Holders shall enter and exit the installation only at the designated access points when open to the public. The designated access point is Gate 2 (600 Gate).
- D2. Upon entering the installation, Permit Holders must proceed directly to the sign-in station at Building 600.
- D3. The following sign-in procedures must be observed:



D3.1. Permit Holders shall sign in/out using the logbook located at Building 600.

D3.2. Staff has the authority to refuse entry to any individual who cannot present proper identification and Permit documentation. A Vehicle Pass alone does not grant access to U.S. Air Force property.

D3.3 Permit Holders shall review the Management Unit Board at the sign-in station. This Board identifies which Management Units and Campgrounds are open for public access, as well as any Management Units and/or Campgrounds closed by administrative action. This Board is the only official open/closure listing and should be reviewed upon every entry.

D3.4 As updates to the military range schedules can occur within 24hrs, it is the Permit Holder's responsibility to check the Management Unit status each day. This can be done at the time of sign-in, or by reviewing the information kiosks at Willingham, Morgan Hole and Austin Hammock Campgrounds. Up-to-date scheduling

information is available on the Avon Park AFR Outdoor Recreation app or at <https://avon.isportsman.net/info.aspx>.

- D4. Permit Holders who fail to sign in or out are subject to having their recreational privileges revoked.
- D5. All Permit Holders shall be signed out and off the installation by the posted gate closure time on a closing night, regardless of their activities at that time. Repeated tardiness may be subject to suspension of recreational privileges.
- D6. Access for recreational activities is always subject to limitations based on the military mission and hunting season. As such, public access may or may not be permitted at any time or as authorized by the Installation Commander. The Weekend Recreation Schedule will be adjusted in response to canceled military activities within 24 hours, subject to availability of staff and/or volunteers.
- D7. Permit Holders may launch and land boats at the Kissimmee River boat ramp only after being signed in at the Outdoor Recreation Office. Mooring boats is prohibited outside of the designated boundaries of the Fort Kissimmee Campground and the Fort Kissimmee Cemetery.
- D8. Management Unit 14 and the northwest corner of Management Unit 4 (Ivey) shall be utilized by Military Permit Holders seven (7) days per week if open for recreational use. Public Permit Holders shall utilize these Management Units on weekends if open for recreational use.

## E. Vehicle Use

E1. Each annual Permit Holder will be issued a Vehicle Pass in addition to his/her Permit. This Pass is to be permanently affixed to the outside driver's side windshield of the Permit Holder's vehicle to indicate that he/she is an Outdoor Recreation Permit Holder. The Vehicle Pass allows for easy identification of the vehicle by installation staff in the case of emergencies. Vehicle Passes are **NOT** the equivalent of a Permit for access. The Permit Holder will be held accountable for the actions of all individuals operating or riding in a vehicle bearing his/her Vehicle Pass.

E2. If the vehicle bearing a Vehicle Pass is sold or transferred to another individual, the Pass shall be removed before the vehicle leaves the Permit Holder's possession and returned (whole or in pieces) to the Outdoor Recreation Office.

E3. Permit Holders shall park their vehicles on the same side of the road as the Management Unit they are entering, **or in areas designated on the current year map, if applicable.**

E4. Should Permit Holders hear three (3) blasts from an air horn while on the installation, they shall cease all other activities and return to their vehicles immediately. Updated information will be posted to the Avon Park AFR Outdoor Recreation app.

E5. Military, Air Force contractor and official AF Program vehicles always have the right-of-way.

E6. Driving around or moving any type of barricade is strictly prohibited.

E7. The use of tracked vehicles, motorized cycles, golf carts, ATVs, LSVs, UTVs, rail buggies, and/or dirt bikes, is prohibited. Only rubber-tired vehicles not previously listed are allowed. This prohibition includes all ATVs, LSVs, UTVs, and/or rail buggies, which may otherwise be considered street legal.

E8. A Law Enforcement Officer may search any camp, vehicle or boat in accordance with the law. No person shall refuse or obstruct such inspection by any authorized officer of the state.

E9. Bicycle use is authorized on all designated roads, as well as along all unmarked fence lines and firebreaks.

E9.1. Riders must wear a highly visible outer garment during the day and an outer garment containing retro-reflective material at night.

E9.2. Riders must wear a properly fastened, approved (e.g. Consumer Product Safety Commission, ANSI, Snell Memorial Foundation, or host nation equivalent) bicycle helmet.

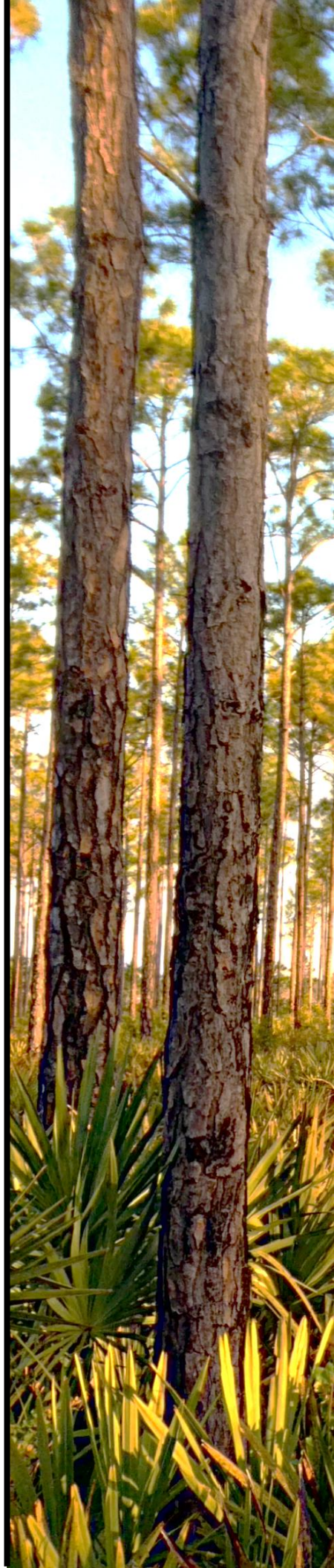
E9.3. Mopeds, motorcycles, electric bicycles (e-bikes), and pedal-assist bicycles, are prohibited. The Outdoor Recreation Program does not authorize those with State-issued Alternative Mobility Permits (AMP) to use e-bikes on USAF property.

E10. No person shall park any vehicle in a manner which obstructs a road, gate, bridge, or firebreak.

E11. No person shall ride upon any vehicle in a manner not designated or intended for the use of passengers.

E12. The use of vehicles is prohibited between 22:00 and 04:30, except on **Jennings**, Frostproof, Smith, Old Bravo, and Kissimmee Roads (or during verifiable emergencies, or after having received prior approval by the Outdoor Recreation Office).

E13. Vehicles **shall** be operated only on roads designated on the current year **Avenza** map. If a Permit Holder is caught without permission on a road **or trail** not designated on the current year



map, he/she will be subject to suspension. Exceptions include:

E13.1. Exception 1: **Hunt-type** Permit Holders may drive on existing firebreaks to retrieve downed game only after receiving verbal authorization from Outdoor Recreation staff.

E13.2. Exception 2: After receiving verbal authorization from the Outdoor Recreation Office, Permit Holders with FWC-issued Special Use Vehicle Certificates may be driven down firebreaks or unmarked trails to be dropped off and/or picked up from his/her declared hunting location. Vehicles shall not be parked off-road on firebreaks or unmarked trail; vehicles shall be returned to and parked on named roads as designated on the current year map.

E13.3. Exception 3: **Hunt-type** Permit Holders may drive **on existing** firebreaks range-wide after General Gun Season until the end of Small Game Season (see Section 5) without first obtaining permission from the Outdoor Recreation Office. **This exception does not apply to Dog Hunt-type Permit Holders participating in any scheduled Limited Entry Dog Hunt during this period (see para M6.).**

## Section 3: Recreation

Avon Park Air Force Range is a designated Wildlife Management Area (WMA) with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC). All Avon Park AFR hunting and fishing season dates are set within Federal and State frameworks established annually. **All applicable Federal and State wildlife regulations apply.** For exact wording of the State wildlife laws and regulations, see FWC's Florida Statute and Administrative Code which is on file with the Secretary of State and state libraries ([flrules.org](http://flrules.org)).



### F. General Regulations

F1. The **use or** possession of remote-controlled aircraft or drones is strictly prohibited.

F2. The **use or** possession of fireworks is strictly prohibited. Nothing shall leave the ground.

F3. The use or possession of metal detectors is strictly prohibited.

F4. Digging and/or all forms of ground disturbance are strictly prohibited.

F5. Horses are prohibited, unless authorized by the Installation Commander or designee.

F6. Spotlighting is prohibited, unless authorized by the Installation Commander or designee.

F7. Consumption of alcohol will be limited to Campgrounds only. State laws regarding transportation and consumption of alcohol apply.

F8. No ordnance or any other military material shall be tampered with, handled or removed from the installation. Areas where suspected unexploded ordnance (UXO) is found must be vacated immediately and the location reported to Outdoor Recreation Program personnel.



F9. No one shall tamper with or remove any equipment, supplies or materials not placed by the individual or without written permission from the owner of the equipment.

F10. Only dead and downed wood may be cut and collected as firewood and used only at Avon Park Air Force Range. Firewood brought onto the installation shall be burned or removed from the property upon departure.

F11. Gates found in a condition other than that of which the gate was left by staff may subsequently be locked without notice.

F12. Hunting, fishing and outdoor recreation is prohibited on any portion of the installation posted as closed to those activities.

F13. People, dogs, vehicles, and other recreational equipment, are prohibited in areas posted as "Closed to Public Access" by U.S. Air Force administrative action.

F14. All fires are prohibited, except as stated in para G1.

F15. Unethical behavior will result in loss of recreational privileges.

F16. Permit Holders shall be barred from the installation for posting, publishing or distributing any information or photos deemed sensitive to the military mission to any websites, forums or social media platforms. This includes, but is not limited to, information regarding military training operations, photos of military activities, personnel or equipment and/or names of individuals involved in military operations.



F17. Killing or attempting to kill or wound endangered or threatened species, or species of special concern, is prohibited. Capturing, harming, harassing, or possessing, any protected species or their nests, eggs, or parts thereof, is prohibited. Current listings of these species can be obtained at the Outdoor Recreation Office.

F18. Taking or possessing any snakes, including venomous snakes, is prohibited.

# WARNING

It is a Federal crime, under 18 U.S.C. §795, to photograph or sketch any military installation without first obtaining authorization from the Installation Commander. Furthermore, it is a Federal crime, under 18 U.S.C. §797, to reproduce, publish, sell, or give away, any photograph, picture or graphic representation of a defense installation without the authorization of the Installation Commander.





## G. Camping Regulations

G1. Fires are permitted only in the Campgrounds. No fires shall be left unattended until fully extinguished (cold). Fires shall be contained while burning. Fire bans shall be observed when in effect.

G2. Campground quiet hours are 23:00 – 04:30. People and/or their dogs creating excessive noise or exhibiting other behaviors that disturb other campers shall be removed from the installation. Generators may be used 24-hours a day in designated areas.

G3. No camping will be allowed within 25 feet of a picnic pavilion, pump, latrine, shower facility, or campground boundary.

G4. No camping, vehicles or trailers will be allowed within 25 feet of a body of water in any Campground.

G5. All trash shall be properly disposed of in the dumpsters provided at Building 600. The dumpsters are for trash generated at the Campgrounds. Dumpsters shall not be utilized for the disposal of any hazardous waste.

G6. Emptying grey water or septic tanks from campers into the porta-potties, **onto the ground or into a body of water** is prohibited.

G7. Vehicles may not be stored in any Campground. A single tent, camper and/or trailer may be stored for an additional fee per item, but any storage of fuel or other flammable liquid is prohibited with the exception of butane or propane in certified tanks up to a maximum of 40lbs per trailer/camper. Camping equipment shall be stored no earlier than one (1) week before the start of Muzzleloader Season and removed no later than one (1) week after the end of Spring Turkey Season, or as authorized by the Installation Commander.

### G8. Public Specific Camping Instructions

G8.1. Willingham, Morgan Hole and Fort Kissimmee Campgrounds are the only designated campgrounds for PRA Permit Holders. Campground boundaries are delineated on the map and marked with signs in the field. Camping spots are first come, first served; reserving spots is prohibited.

### G9. Military Specific Camping Instructions

G9.1. Austin Hammock Campground is the only designated campground for Military Hunt Permit Holders. Campground boundaries are delineated on the map and marked with signs in the field.

**G9.2. Military Permits (as outlined in para B2.) include Camper Storage at Austin Hammock at no additional charge. Those wishing to store a camper or tent at Willingham or Morgan Hole Campgrounds are required to purchase a Camper Storage Permit as stated in para G7.; see also para A8.1.1. for eligibility restrictions.**

G9.3. Military Permit Holders may occupy a camper or tent at Austin Hammock Campground for a maximum of fourteen (14) consecutive days, subject to accessibility.

## H. Fishing Regulations

H1. Motorized vessels are prohibited in any marsh on Avon Park Air Force Range at any time, unless otherwise authorized by the Installation Commander or designee. Motorless vessels are allowed in marshes only during Migratory Bird Season.

H2. Aggressive alligators shall be reported to Outdoor Recreation staff.

H3. Trotlines and brush hooks are prohibited.

H4. Permit Holders may fish any body of water that is accessible in an open Management Unit.

H5. Boats are restricted to a maximum engine size of ten (10) horsepower on Tomlin Hammock Lake. Gas or electric trolling motors may be used.

H6. Airboats may be trailered across Avon Park Air Force Range to the Kissimmee River boat ramp. Airboats shall only be launched at the Kissimmee River boat ramp.

H7. Daily and possession bag limits will follow FWC regulations. Exception: catfish are catch and release only between 15 April and 15 June annually at Van Eeghan Ponds 1, 2, 3, and Tomlin Hammock Lake. These fish area stocked and fed to gain size prior to the Youth Fishing Derby.

### H8. Military Specific Fishing Instructions

**H8.1. The Lake Arbuckle boat ramp is for the sole usage of Military and Staff Permit Holders and is not a public boat ramp.**

# Section 4: Hunting

## I. General Hunting Regulations

I1. All harvested game shall be checked at the Outdoor Recreation Office (Building 600) with Outdoor Recreation staff. A self-check form will be made available for game harvested after hours or when Outdoor Recreation staff are unable to check in game. White-tailed deer and wild turkey shall also be reported to FWC per State regulations.

I2. Field dressing of harvested game is strictly prohibited.

I3. Legal bucks shall have a minimum of three (3) points on one side, except under the circumstances stated in para N4., regardless of main beam length.

I4. Baiting of game is prohibited throughout the installation at all times, unless authorized by the Installation Commander. As such, the unauthorized introduction or transport of grain onto or across the installation is prohibited.

I5. Tree stands, ground blinds and game cameras, are limited to three (3) per person. All hunting equipment brought onto the installation shall be labeled with the owner's FWC Customer ID # so that the owner may be contacted by staff if necessary. All hunting equipment is subject to random checks and shall be confiscated by Outdoor Recreation or FWC Law Enforcement if deemed noncompliant with these regulations.

I6. Tree stands shall be placed one (1) week prior to the opening of Archery Season until one (1) week after the end of General Gun Season, as shown in Section 5. All traces that hunting equipment was present shall also be removed (i.e. flagging tape, markers, etc.).

I7. No tree stands or ground blinds are allowed within 100 feet of a white banded tree.

I8. No hunting activity or equipment is allowed within 100 feet of an impact area.

I9. In the case of conflict between Permit Holders concerning tree stand or ground blind placement, if a resolution cannot be reached, all parties will be moved to different Management Units.



I10. Tree stand placement is first come, first served. The earlier placement of trail cameras or flagging tape does not reserve a hunting spot.

I11. A Fall Arrest System/Full Body Harness is required. The Fall Arrest System or Full Body Harness shall be worn and properly attached to a tree while a tree stand is in use.

I12. A short tether shall be maintained between the tree and the Permit Holder with no slack while in the seated position.

I13. A haul line shall be used to raise/lower equipment. Firearms shall be unloaded and pointed away from the Permit Holder while being hauled up a tree stand.

I14. Permit Holders shall ensure they have a Fall Rescue, Relief and Recovery Plan in case of emergency. Prolonged suspension from a harness can be fatal.

I15. Permit Holders using ladder stands shall maintain three (3) points of contact with the ladder at all times. Permit Holders using climber stands shall have a connector strap and be connected to the tree at all times. Permit Holders using hang-on stands shall secure the tether at eye level or above. Proper procedures to utilize hang-on stands (accessing the platform from above) shall be observed.

I16. Permit Holders shall inspect their tree stand(s) and Fall Arrest System(s) prior to



climbing the stand.

I17. Game shall be hunted from one half-hour before sunrise until one half-hour after sunset, except during Spring Turkey Season. Legal hunting hours for Spring Turkey Season are one half-hour before sunrise until 13:00.

I18. A group of three (3) or more people on foot shall not concentrate, drive, rally, or stir up, game, except during Small Game Season after General Gun Season ends (see Section 5).

I19. All personal possessions shall be removed from the installation at the end of each weekend, unless otherwise specified. The U.S. Air Force is not liable for the loss or vandalism of any items or equipment brought onto the installation. Unauthorized items left behind will be confiscated.

## J. Youth Events

J1. All Youth Hunt Events (Deer, Alligator, Spring Turkey) are open to the dependents and/or non-dependents (grandchildren, nieces/nephews, etc.) of current Hunt and Companion Hunt Permit Holders.

J2. Participants of Youth Hunt Events are required to register as per instructions from the Outdoor Recreation Program Manager. All non-dependents require a signed and notarized Parental Consent Form.



J2.1. Participants of the Youth Deer and Spring Turkey Hunt Events shall be 15 years of age or younger at the time of the Youth Hunt.

J2.2. Participants of the Youth Alligator Hunt shall be between the ages of 12 and 15 at the time of the Youth Hunt.

J3. Participants of the Youth Fishing Derby are required to register with the Outdoor Recreation Office on the day of the Derby, or as instructed. Participants shall be 15 years of age or younger.

## K. Permissible Weapons and Firearms

K1. Permissible weapons and firearms shall follow State statutes, with the following exceptions:

K1.1. During Archery Season, only archery equipment may be brought onto the installation. Only Hunt or Companion Hunt Permit Holders with a State-issued Disabled Crossbow Permit may use crossbows during Archery Season; **dependents under 18 years of age are exempt from this requirement.** Longbows, crossbows and recurve bows shall have a minimum draw weight of 30lbs. Arrows used to take deer, turkey or hogs shall be equipped with broadheads having a minimum width of seven-eighths inches. Pistols of any kind are prohibited. A **pistol** is hereby defined as a firearm designed to be held and fired by the use of a single hand, having a barrel length of nine (9) inches or less, and having a magazine inserted into the grip, or in the case of revolvers, cartridges inserted into the cylinder.

K1.2. During General Gun and Small Game Season, only shotguns, archery equipment (including crossbows), muzzleloading firearms, rim-fire rifles (maximum velocity of 1,300fps), and pistols (as defined in K1.1.), are allowed.

K1.3. During Spring Turkey Season, shotguns using Number 2 or smaller diameter are allowed, as well as archery equipment and crossbows as stated in para K1.1. Hunting hours end at 13:00.

K1.4. During Limited Entry Dog Hunts, permissible firearms will follow General Gun Season (para K1.2.), unless otherwise stated by the Program Manager.

K2. Centerfire rifles and fully automatic firearms are prohibited.

K3. Only Hunt and Companion Hunt Permit Holders, underage children under direct control of a Hunt or Companion Hunt Permit Holder and Hunt Guests of Hunt or Companion Hunt Permit Holders, shall possess firearms or archery equipment during the appropriate season. The possession of any type of firearm or archery equipment by any individual outside the posted hunting season is prohibited,

unless specifically authorized by the Installation Commander.

K4. No person shall carry a concealed weapon (even with a permit) while on Avon Park Air Force Range property.

K5. All firearms, including crossbows, shall be unloaded, completely empty of ammunition, while at the Outdoor Recreation Office or any Campground.

K6. Firearms (including crossbows) shall be completely unloaded while being transported by vehicle.

K7. A firearm, regardless of any caliber or draw weight, shall not be fired from a moving vehicle or from inside the cab of a stationary vehicle.

K8. A firearm shall not be discharged across or into any boundary lines of any impact area or area closed to public access, or from or across any roadway designated on the **current year Avenza map**, and/or within fifty (50) feet of Kissimmee Road.

K9. The discharge of firearms or the use of archery equipment is prohibited within 200 yards of the marked boundary of any designated public campsite.

K10. Target practice is prohibited throughout the installation.

K11. The firing ranges on this installation are not open to any Permit Holders.

K12. Pre-charged pneumatic **airbows, air crossbows and** air guns are prohibited.

### **K13. Military Specific Permissible Weapons and Firearms Instructions**

K13.1. Management Unit L.H. Thomas is designated as archery equipment only, as outlined in para K1.1. All other firearms are prohibited in this Management Unit year-round.



## **L. General Dog Regulations**

L1. All dogs brought onto U.S. Air Force property shall wear a collar bearing the name and contact information of the owner.

L2. Permit Holders are responsible for maintaining up-to-date rabies vaccination for their dog(s) from a certified veterinarian or pet clinic. Permit Holders shall produce, upon request, proof of vaccination in the form of a signed vaccination certificate from a veterinarian or pet clinic; purchase receipts and/or self-administered vaccinations will not be accepted as proof of vaccination.

L3. Dogs shall be under physical restraint at all times, including dogs used for tracking wounded game, except when authorized for the use of taking game. Permit Holders shall obtain authorization from the Outdoor Recreation Office before using dogs to track wounded game.

L4. All Permit Holders who have lost dogs shall report this information to the Outdoor Recreation Office immediately. Permit Holders shall make every effort to locate lost dogs before leaving the installation.

L5. Dogs are allowed in all Campgrounds. It is the responsibility of the dog owner to control his/her dog(s) at all times. Dogs shall be removed from the installation if requested by the Outdoor Recreation Office or Law Enforcement.

L5.1. Dogs may not be left unattended, or stored in a camper or at a campsite, for more than six (6) consecutive hours. Dogs must accompany the owner every time the owner leaves the installation.



L6. In all cases, Permit Holders are responsible for all actions of their dog(s).

L7. No person shall knowingly or negligently allow any dog(s) to pursue or molest any wildlife during any period in which the taking of wildlife is prohibited.

L8. The training of hunting dogs is prohibited, except during hunting seasons where dogs are already allowed.

L9. The use of dogs to take or pursue game during Spring Turkey Season is prohibited.

L10. No dogs shall run loose between sunset and sunrise, unless authorized by the Installation Commander.

L11. Hunt and Companion Hunt Permit Holders may hunt waterfowl and snipe with dogs in Kissimmee Marsh in Management Unit 10A and Arbuckle Marsh in Management Units 13 and 14 during the overlap with General Gun Season. All other Small Game hunters shall utilize the designated Dog Units and/or Management Unit 4 for the effective permit year during this time (see Section 4-M and Section 5).

**L12. The use of dogs to take or pursue legal game is prohibited in all Military Recreation Area Management Units, except for small game hunting with bird dogs in Unit 14 and Ivey, without prior authorization from the Outdoor Recreation Office.**

## M. Limited Entry Dog Hunts (PRA Only)

M1. Limited Entry Dog Hunts are authorized by the Installation Commander during which dogs may be used for the pursuit and take of white-tailed deer and wild hog in the designated Dog Units (see Avenza map). During the scheduled dog hunt weekends, only participants in the dog hunts and Small Game hunters shall hunt in the designated Dog Units. All other Hunt and Companion Hunt Permit Holders may hunt in the remaining open PRA Management Units. Management Units 3, 3A, 4, and 7 west of Old Bravo Road, are authorized for still hunting and Small Game hunting with dogs during the overlap with General Gun Season (see Avenza map).

M2. Up to 120 slots each are available for participation in the Limited Entry Deer and Hog Dog Hunts. Permit Holders who purchase the combination PRA Annual Hunt Permit with Deer and Hog Dogs (see para B5.) contribute to both total participation limits for the scheduled dog hunts.

M3. All dogs will be accounted for before the hunt, to include verification of rabies vaccination paperwork, GPS and behavioral correction collars and a total count of dogs. Spot checks by staff or FWC Law Enforcement may occur.

M4. Deer Dog Hunt Permit Holders are required to register with the State of Florida in accordance with State regulations. Information can be found at <https://myfwc.com/license/recreational/hunting/deer-dog/>.

M5. The gates located on Tick Island and Orange Hammock Roads will be closed and locked for the duration of the scheduled Limited Entry Dog Hunts to prevent dogs entering South Conventional Range. Outdoor Recreation staff shall be notified immediately should any dogs enter restricted areas.

**M6. Dog Hunt Permit Holders are required to receive prior authorization from the Outdoor Recreation Office before driving any established firebreaks or trails to retrieve downed game during a scheduled Limited Entry Dog Hunt (see paras E13. E13.1. and E13.3.).**

**M7. During the scheduled Limited Entry Deer Dog Hunt, only white-tailed deer are authorized for take or pursuit by use of deer dogs.**

**M8. During the scheduled Limited Entry Hog Dog Hunt, only feral hogs are authorized for take or pursuit by use of hog dogs.**

## N. Season Information

N1. Any hunt season may end early once the harvest quotas have been met for that season/species.

N2. Migratory Bird Season shall follow dates as published at <https://myfwc.com/regulations/hunting/birds/> for Zone C, except where they overlap with Archery and Muzzleloader Seasons.

N3. When the buck harvest reaches half of the total limit, restrictions on legal game shall be automatically increased to four (4) points on one side the following weekend. The Outdoor Recreation Program will make notice of this the Wednesday before that weekend.

N4. Snipe Season shall run concurrent with Small Game Season, except as stated in paras L11. and L12.1.

N5. During Small Game Season, the use of dogs to pursue or take wild hogs, rabbits and coyotes is prohibited, unless authorized by the Installation Commander.



The Outdoor Recreation Program has published its Recreation Area maps on **AVENZA MAPS**.

Permit Holders can now download a FREE copy of the Avon Park Air Force Range map directly to their iPhone or Android device. When downloaded for offline use, Permit Holders can get real-time navigation with or without cellular service.

# Section 6: Violations

## O. Violation Procedures

01. The Schedule of Violations (below) does not include every possible offense and is not comprehensive. Violations not included in this Schedule will be included in the official Violation Report, along with a recommendation of penalties. The penalties listed here are suggestions; in all cases, the actual penalty is at the complete discretion of the Installation Commander.

02. When a violation occurs, the following procedures will be enacted:

02.1. Upon notice of a violation, the Program Manager will inform the affected Permit Holder(s) of the regulation(s) violated and the suggested penalty, based on the Violation Schedule. The penalty will be enforced at the time of notification. iSportsman privileges will also be suspended during the penalty period.

02.2. An official Violation Report will be drafted and filed with the Installation Commander for review. A memorandum will be sent to the affected Permit Holder(s) to the email address on file through iSportsman. This will initiate the review process.

02.3. The affected Permit Holder(s) may appeal the penalties in writing to the Installation Commander once the review process has begun.

02.4. The enacted penalties will be enforced until either amended by the Installation Commander or the penalty period expires, whichever comes first.
